
KSU Football Games

The wild flowers have mostly put themselves to bed for the winter, still a few hardy sunflowers and mounds of white heath asters are in bloom. It's a great time to see the grasses—swtich, indian, big blue and purple top.

Stillmans trail had lots of red sumac, some heath asters and fluffy white bonset.

The quarry trail has some purple aromic aster and lots of fall joe rye weed.

Soon they will mow everything—but in the Spring we should have lots of bloomers.
