

## **Outdoor Encounters**

One of the many social dynamics in our lives that can cause tension is whether to comment on another's opinion or to just leave it alone. This tension sometimes is rooted in the old adage "Beauty is in the eye of the beholder." This time-honored truism reveals the deeply subjective nature of beauty, which—to quote Webster—is anything that has "the quality or aggregate of qualities in a person or thing that gives pleasure to the senses or pleasurably exalts the mind or spirit."

Tolerance is as necessary here as in any other arena of human endeavor. The list of what any of us personally considers as beautiful is not a subject for which judgment from another contributes anything positive. My 75-year-old great Grandmother Wright, busy using a rug beater on a throw rug she had draped over her clothesline, gave this eight-year-old a life lesson with her response to some smart-aleck comment I had made: "Everyone to his own likin' said the old woman—as she kissed the cow."

Many entities seem to hold a greater innate beauty than do others. How long has it been since you've seen someone **not follow** a butterfly in flight? But our esthetic sense is a bit harder to muster concerning a rusty nail or old tilting barn, a wet and rotting pine cone or tree or the mangled carcass of a road kill. But each of these has a history and probably one or more beautiful moments in their conception, construction, use, or significance. We often forget that, to realize some beauty, the big picture and the long view are required.

But there's enough beauty to go around, with each person being enriched by whatever makes **that** person vibrate. Although I'm a great fan of Leonardo de Vinci's work, his "Mona Lisa" in the Louvre did much less for me than did the variously named sculpture—also in the Louvre—that I call the "Winged Victory of Samothrace." This work really got to me; my emotions were on the surface each of the many moments I stared at her. Coyote song or a V-shaped chorus of geese against the sky will do the same.

Fortunately, beauty is everywhere, in every conceivable form. I also love leafed-out trees, but

consider dead, bark-bare trees to be beautiful. Such trees provide yet another micro-habitat in Nature's never ending need for them. A variety of habitats is the launch pad for a healthy biodiversity—the mother of any healthy ecosystem. Significance is a part of beauty.

Most of us stop for beauty, perhaps more frequently than we realize, with touring an art gallery being one of the most obvious examples. We may stop for anything that sparks in us the sensation Webster described. Even the hardened heart or one now devoid of hope may stop for beauty—or beauty may stop for them. Birds and flowers do this! The late, great poet, Emily Dickinson, had something to say about this. And, if significance is added to the equation, most all of the countless parts and particles of Nature contain a beauty that may be—in its way—more profound than what you are seeing in the moment. Life has a way!

It seems that many MLH residents pay at least some attention to what is outside. This is an healthful activity. Because it is, many dollars (much donated) have been spent supporting the work of MLH employees, various contractors, and MLH volunteers to enhance the natural beauty and bio-diversity of our campus—and to provide accessibility to its more remote areas.

Beauty knows no season! All that is required, especially in winter, is to listen quietly and patiently, to look closely—and to study some histories! So, bundle up and get out there. Treat your body, mind, and soul to a jump start. Who could not find time for something so totally healthful—out where beauty awaits?
