
This system helps the Ambassador Committee better identify which individuals at Meadowlark Hills want companionship and assistance

**Board of Trustees-** Several members of the Council attended the last meeting of the BOT. Jean expressed the appreciation of the Council for being invited. Dirk Daveline extended an invitation to the Council to attend the next BOT meeting.

#### **Approval of January Minutes**

One change was proposed by Don Rasmussen to the Representative Duties. The change made was to the purpose statement of the duties. The change reads: "To serve as a forum in which residents participate in the governance of the Meadowlark Hills retirement community. The council functions as an advocate for all Independent Living residents. It also serves as a liaison between all residents and the Board of Trustees." The change was made and approved. The amended January minutes were then approved by a unanimous vote.

#### **Action Items**

- **A. Political Signs/Meetings Policy-** The committee has worked to put together a policy which was handed out during the Resident Council meeting. There are still a few items that need to be finished for the policy and the committee will meet once more to address those items. They will then present the completed policy to the Reps at the next Resident Council meeting in March.
- **B. Pedestrian/Vehicle Safety-** Amanda Rall reported that no one has stepped forward to champion the Safety Committee. She reported that the safety information is in the Resident Handbook and the information is included in the employee in-service. She has arranged for the AARP Safe Driving Course to be held in March on the Meadowlark Hills campus.
- C. Crosswalk Stripes Paint- Don Rasmussen reported that Mike is still researching different types of paint to use on the crosswalks.
- **D. Email Group-** Amanda Rall sent out a few emails to make sure that all of the addresses were correct. She will use this email list to send out Resident Council minutes and a list of new move-ins.
- **E.** Weekend Resource Number- Jean Beatty has checked for the last couple of weekends and the Weekend Resource number has been posted each time at the Hospitality Desk.

- **F. Emergency Transportation-** The cost of transportation was addressed in the Meadowlark Hills Messenger by Annie Peace.
- **G. Washers and Dryers-** Dirk Daveline reported that all of the washers and dryers are going to be replaced in the main building. This should be done within 30 to 60 days.

#### **New Business**

- 1. Signage at Entrances- Lonnie Baker reported that this has been discussed many times before. He said that a survey will be conducted or the issue will be discussed in Focus Groups to see if this is needed.
- 2. Neighborhood/Floor Checklist- Jean asked all of the representatives to create a checklist for new residents. The checklists will be presented at the March Resident Council meeting.

#### **Questions and Concerns**

- 1. Second Floor Hallway- Pat Vogt mentioned that the west wing hallway on the second floor is always very warm.
- **2. Keys and Security-** Lonnie reported that a security system is being looked into for Meadowlark Hills. He said that there needs to be more discussion and feedback on this issue.
