

RESIDENT COUNCIL MINUTES

Meeting Date: May 4, 2015

Sandra Emley welcomed all meeting attendees.

Updates:

- General Update: Lonnie shared that Garrett Lee, Health Services Director, will be leaving Meadowlark Hills to move back to Oklahoma. Lonnie also reported that new state surveyors were assigned to Meadowlark Hills by the State of Kansas. With new surveyors brings new challenges. Lonnie explained the change is a process and takes a lot of time and energy, but we will get through it.
- There have been new hires and changes within the staff. The new Director of Nursing is Jennifer Schoenhofer who replaced Alana Johnston when she moved with her husband who took a job out of the area. As a result of Garrett leaving, Annie Peace has accepted the position of Health Services Director. Service areas that are included in Health Services are Nursing Services, Household Operations, Therapy Services, Social Services and Environmental Services. Jayme Minton, currently the Human Resources Leader, will move to the Support Services Director role. Services areas that Jayme will provide leadership to are Human Resources, Information Services, Food & Beverage Services and Chaplain Services. The Human Resources Leader position has been posted at this time. Sarah Duggan will remain in her role as the Community Relations Director. Two additional teams have moved to the Community Relations area Home Health and the Physician's Practice.
- Lonnie followed up and reminded us that in 1980 Meadowlark Hills opened its doors and we are looking to revamp our mission as we have outgrown our mission statement.
- Seating Committee Update: Polly Ferrell spoke about the signage in Prairie Star. The sign reads, "Please wait to be seated," but there are times people are not acknowledged and are unsure what to do. In order for the sign to be effective, the need for a hostess is required on a regular basis. It was recognized the primary cause was staff is not available at times. Lonnie Baker also interjected that the renovation to Prairie Star will help with the seating issue in the future. Landscaping/Rumble Strips Update: Loren Alexander reported residents expressed the bushes around the unit's
- Landscaping/Rumble Strips Update: Loren Alexander reported residents expressed the bushes around the unit's closet to Kimball Avenue need some attention. Loren explained at this time, the grounds crew is aware and Blueville Nursery has a plan. Loren also reported since painting was under way and getting close to completion, implementation of the rumble strips would start shortly. There was a question concerning signage and crosswalks once the rumble strips were completed. Loren stated he will follow up concerning signage.
- Bingo Committee Update: Marla Bugbee shared about the history of the Bingo Committee. Marla gave a list of some of the items money from Bingo has provided for Meadowlark Hills over the years. They include the big screen television that was once in the Community Room, a dolly for the baby grand piano, seasonal decorations, spot light for the flag pole and most recently the cabinets that were recently installed behind the Hospitality Desk. Marla encouraged everyone to try at least one Bingo night and you won't be disappointed.

Approval of April Minutes:

Motion to approve minutes was moved, seconded and passed unanimously.

New Business:

- Trail System: Don Rasmussen asked where the trail system stood in the future within the budget. He explained there are trails that run parallel to Kimball that would be great for walking, exercising and should be brought up to rustic trails standards. Lonnie advised there is a budget line and Mike will be involved in decisions along with buildings and grounds. The trails most likely will not be discussed this summer, but anticipates it to be brought up during winter time planning and possibly implementation next spring. Lonnie reminded the council that for now, the Honstead and Sloan renovation is priority.
- Patio/Verna Belles: The Patio Furniture outside of Prairie Star is weathered and worn and should not be left out. The back legs of the chairs in Verna Belles stick out. A few residents have tripped over them.
- In house mail distribution: Polly Ferrell stated she felt there is a need for in-house mail distribution by offering mailboxes to residents who live outside of the Village. Lonnie and Sarah both expressed this issue has been brought up in the past, but can be revisited to see if any new answers or solutions would arise.

Old Business:

Neighborhood Election – Ivan Topkins was unanimously reelected to the Eastside neighborhood and Sharon Smith was reelected for the Westside neighborhood.
