Renovation Updates & Upcoming Concrete Work


Concrete work in front of the Physician's office and loading dock is scheduled to begin Tuesday, Sept. 8, and will last approximately four weeks, depending on weather.

The resident parking spaces will be available to the residents during the construction, however, there may be times that the delivery vehicles will block the drive. The parking spaces designated for the Physician's office will not be available during the concrete work, but temporary spaces will be located to the north of the building and marked with signage. Additionally, an alternate sidewalk will be installed coming from the north to the Physician's office door for use during the time of construction.

Traffic will not be able to pass through the construction zone in front of the Physicians Office.

There will be a walkway for residents to use coming from the west exit of the tower and around the construction to the Physician's office. And the renovation project continues in Honstead and Sloan House! The team has set a start date of Monday, Sept. 21, for the next phase on this renovation project, which will focus on the sun room area.

Honoring Their Daddy, Who Didn't Come Home

For readers too young to remember World War II, a little history: In 1945, the war in Europe had been

won, but there was still fierce fighting the Japanese in the South Pacific. Our Marines were terribly outnumbered when they fought in a little place called Iwo Jima. We had very heavy losses of lives.



But our Marines

prevailed and exhausted survivors struggled to raise a heavy flag pole so that our Old Glory could fly in victory. A news photographer was there and took a photo of the Marines struggling to raise that heavy flag pole. That became the most popular photo of World War II. A statue was made of the Marines and their flag pole.

Flash forward to last year: My friend here in Manhattan, Phil Anderson, told me that his father volunteered to fight for his country. His father was one of the Marines killed in Iwo Jima. As a six-year-old little boy, Phil couldn't understand why his daddy wasn't coming home.

I was older than Phil, but I knew how much it hurt when some of my friends didn't come home. So I asked our U.S. Senator Moran to arrange in honor of Phil's father. That his father was honored is in the nation's record. The flag was sent to Phil, with a certificate attesting that it had been flown over the Capitol in honor of Phil's father. Phil and his brother (who lives in another state) were very touched, as were their children and grandchildren. But there was more...

The 70th anniversary of that terrible fight at Iwo Jima was celebrated a few months ago. And Phil and Dave were there, with their father's flag. They were permitted to fly their fathers flag on that famous flag pole the Marines has struggled to raise. As you can see, Old Glory waves in victory. Their daddy didn't come home but it was not in vain. Phil told me how impressed he was by the dignity and respect with which the Japanese officials treated the Americans at the ceremony.

I hope young ones who see the beautiful photo will have some idea of the heavy price paid in American lives so we may have freedom and fly our Old Glory.
