### **Service of Remembrance**


The Service of Remembrance for March is canceled. There will not be a service on Friday, March 27.

### **Outdoor Encounters—Warm Farming**

Wouldn't it be handy if the most successful fish bait, night crawlers, were available near the pond whenever you wished to fish? We are trying to make that happen by establishing a worm farm. It is composed of five plastic bins, 16 inch by 16 inch, stacked five high. The top four bins are perforated for air circulation and liquid drainage. Peat moss, soil, table scraps, starter worms and shredded paper are loaded onto the trays. Table scraps and water are added to the top tray every couple days. The bottom perforated tray is removed weekly, the worms and liquid fertilizer harvested and the tray prepared and placed on top. To retrieve worms simply

remove the lid covering the top tray and turn the contents with a garden tool. Paper cups and lids will be available for transport to the fishing dock.

Don Rasmussen needs two volunteers to help tend the farm. It requires only 15 minutes, once a week. Contact Don at (785) 537-8775 to help with the worms. An old stock tank may also be outfitted with soil and table scraps and pit into work production.


