
MH² Challenge Update

New cabinet at the Hospitality Desk



Response to Star Gazing

One of the wonderful things about living at Meadowlark is the many talented retirees who are willing to share knowledge gained during their lifetime. One such example occurred over St. Patrick's day weekend. It all started with a "name a star" offer that came across Roger and Kay Shanks' daughter, Michelle McGuires's email. Michelle purchased the naming rights to a star as a birthday gift for Roger O'dell Shanks who turned 84 that year. It's hard to find a good gift for an 84 year-old who has everything Michelle reasoned. Naming a star after Roger's middle name seemed like a great idea. Roger has always been very proud of his middle name O'dell; he passed the name to his son Monty O'dell who passed the name to his son Mack O'dell. Purchase of the naming rights to the star located in the Leo constellation at star astronomical coordinates D 9deg 14' 16" RA_h_m_s catalog number TYC 839-207-1 came with a certificate and a map of where the star could be found in the sky.

At this point the story Kay Shanks talked to her friends Don and Bea Rasmussen. Don is an avid star gazer and he owns a 8' telescope. Together they planned an event to learn more about the O'dell star. After some



research Don determined that St. Patrick's weekend was a rare opportunity to see Jupiter and two of its moons with a third moon forecast to come from behind the giant planet during the ceremony. The line of sight to the O'dell star is, at this time, close to that of Jupiter. The weather cooperated and it was warm and clear on the night we selected. Don first led an education session for our family. Following the education we were able to go out back of Meadowlark's maintenance shed to an area where Don and Bea had setup his 8' telescope. He also set out cots where we could lie down and look up for optimal star viewing. We took turns viewing first Jupiter then the O'dell star through the telescope. Following the family outing several Meadowlark residents, staff and family came out to view Jupiter, Venus and stars. Sure enough the third moon pooped out from behind Jupiter. In the end Don shared his love of stars with about 20 folks from age nine to 102 that night. It was a wonderful experience for all. Thanks Don.
