

The Memory Activities Class will also continue to meet from 10 to 11 a.m. Wednesdays in the KSU Class Room. These two memory-enriching opportunities will meet each Wednesday. However, on the fourth Wednesday of each month, we will join together for a **Visual Thinking Strategies Class.** During this monthly session, the Meadowlark Hills Memory Program is collaborating with the Marianna Kistler Beach Museum of Art. Education Assistant, Kim Richards, will conduct a session of Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS) from 10 to 11 a.m. in the KSU Classroom on the fourth Wednesday of the month. Additionally, Bridget Larkin will continue to facilitate a helpful and empowering Memory Care Partner Support Group on the first and third Wednesday of every month from 10 to 11 a.m. in the Tranquility Room (coincides with MAC & Meadowlark Memory Café). Group discussion relates to challenges of a caregiver and ways to cope with the daily struggles of providing care to a loved one with memory and/or cognitive changes.
