From the Readers

On the Tomboy Masters Sewing by Helen Roser

Our neighborhood gang was all boys, except me. I was a girl. We had started playing Kidnap and I didn't want to be the victim or a crook. I wanted to a G-man, but it was decided I could be a G-girl. Just as we were going good, I was called home for a lesson. My mother was trying to teach me how to be a lady when I grew up.

My big sister had come over to teach me how to sew. She brought a b ox of assorted pieces of fabric, a box of difference colors of thread and scissors. She threaded a needle and, with little bitty stitches of thread that matched the fabric, she stitched them together. That, she told me, was how to sew. She brought out a doll I never played with and told me to sew a dress for the doll. Then she left to talk to our mother.

Well, right off, I could think of two ways I could finish the sewing faster so I could get back out to be a G-girl. For one thing, If I used thread a different color than the fabric, I could see where I was easier. And second, if I took big stitches, I could get across the fabric faster.

I picked out black velvet from the box. It looked about right for a dress that dragged on the floor in back, like I had seen in my sister's fashion magazine. So I sewed a dress. The back look more like a tail but nothing was falling off because I had hitched it together with white thread. When my mother saw it, she told me I could go out to play.

Response to Charlottesville by Nathan Bolls

The racial violence that occurred this past Saturday in Charlottesville, VA, reminded us of old challenges—and presented new opportunities. The immediate task for all of us reminded me of my beloved late father-in-law, Don Q. Lamb, of Manhattan, KS. He would call or send a note when someone befriended him or if he heard of some truly humane act by another in this area. His motto was, "How will they know if I don't tell them?"

Many of you have friends who grew up in a different cultural stream, or who live an orientation different from that of the so-called "typical" white Christian American, or who know personally the difficulties imposed by society on those growing up female, or on those who struggle with mental or physical disabilities. All of them have known oppression in this "land of opportunity." During these days these friends must be reminded—with words, warmth, and arms—of the love and respect we have for each of them.

Democracy is a system of individual action. Unfortunately, most of us have forgotten this. Each of us of the overwhelming majority who **do not** stand for the White Supremacist doctrine must make our beliefs known, must not let a vocal and violent minority speak for America.
