All are welcome to attend the free outreach opportunity *Personhood and Dementia*, presented by the K-State Center on Aging. This event is set for Thursday, Nov. 2, from 9 to 11 a.m. and 1 to 3 p.m. in the Hartford Room at the Bluemont Hotel.

Gary Glazner, founder of the Alzheimer's Poetry Project, will guide the attendees through an interactive day of poetry making as the group learns to use poetry to increase interaction and encourage joy in dementia care. Gary emphasizes simple poetry techniques combined with a variety of activities, including dance, exercise, music, storytelling and visual art to facilitate new and positive ways of communicating with people in all stages of dementia.

Additionally, the *Personhood and Dementia* event will feature Karen Clond of the Alzheimer's Association will also share her work with Memories in the Making, a find arts program in which people with Alzheimer's disease create art to boost self esteem and open the channels of communication with loved ones.
