Weekly specials, gifts celebrate first decade of Verna Belle's Café

In February 2019, Verna Belle's Café will mark 10 years of business. Ten years of hearty soups, gooey cinnamon rolls and cheesy quesadillas. From day one, Verna Belle's has been the place to meet friends for lunch after an exercise class or grab a chilled coffee beverage to go. Now, as the 3650th day approaches, it's time to celebrate the café's success and look forward to many future years of satisfying food and fellowship.

Nov. 30 is the anniversary of the café's grand re-opening after last year's renovations, so the first of 10 parties to wish

Verna Belle's a happy birthday is planned for that Friday. Beginning at 7 a.m. when the café opens, there will be a free food or beverage sample each hour to unveil new menu items. Be one of the first to taste the VBC sandwich made with Velveeta cheese, grilled bologna and Kettle chips. Potato chips on a sandwich? An unconventional ingredient to be sure, but the sandwich's creator, Brook Marcotte, encourages you not to knock it 'til you've tried it! Meadowlark honey is drizzled over the layers before the second piece of artisan bread is added.

At 2 p.m. on the 30th and nine consecutive Fridays, sing "Happy Birthday," enjoy a special dessert and watch as staff unwrap a gift for the café provided by Meadowlark. Also beginning Nov. 30, spend at least \$10 during one Verna Belle's visit, and you'll be entered into a weekly drawing for a prize, such as a café gift certificate. The first of nine drawings will be between 2 and 3 p.m. on Friday, Dec. 7.

The final prize drawing is planned for between 2 and 3 p.m. Friday, Feb. 1, the day of the 10th party.



You need not be present to win any of the prizes.

Meadowlark's popular eating and shopping spot opened in February of 2009 in what had been the Starkey House kitchen, dining room and living room. A \$3.5 million capital campaign funded the Bramlage/Wroten building as well as the Community Center renovations and additions. The café was named for Verna Belle Cassell, former owner of a Manhattan potato chip company and a former Meadowlark resident. During her nearly 12 years at Meadowlark, she lived first in a West Tower apartment, then in an Assisted Living apartment, and in three long-term care households before her death in 2011 at the age of 100.

It's a fun coincidence that Verna Belle's initials, VBC, are the same as the abbreviation used for the café. The letters V-B-C hang over the drink station on the café's north wall.

During Verna Belle's residency at Meadowlark, her daughter and son-in-law, Sally and Dennis von Waaden, became quite familiar with the community and approached Meadowlark about making a donation during the Our Home, Our Health, Our Future campaign that began in 2006.

"Steve (Shields, former CEO) may have had the idea to name the café and general store for Verna Belle," Dennis said in 2011. Observant patrons will notice the café signage resembles the bag Verna Belle is holding in the photo on the café's east wall.

The von Waadens find it fitting that Verna Belle's name lives on through the café after she had spent a few decades making and then delivering a snack food – Sally's Quality Spudettes.

"It makes us feel good that people are using the café and appreciate it," Dennis added.

My orders were to "Stay with him as long as possible. If he is on to you, arrange for Sandy to be with him."

Sandy hadn't a clue what was going on. He was on to me so I suggested we three go dancing. He readily agreed.


Out in the snow, I hailed a taxi. Sandy got in the back first. He told me to get in. I said: " Oh no! You next so we can share you!"

He got in. I slammed the door shut and yelled to the driver: "Roseland Ball Room!" and the taxi took off, with them, but not me.

Next day, Sandy had a big scarf around her neck. She took it off. Her neck was badly bruised. She cried: "He scared me! He kept saying 'Who is Helen?' I told him you were my friend."

I told her: "I am so sorry, Sandy. Excuse me, I have to make a phone call." I called the Bureau as ordered. I told him: "He hurt Sandy." The agent told me: "Yes, we know. I am sorry." Click. End of call.

Sandy never understood the connection between a high security clearance and silence.
