Ozark Mountain Christmas

Meadowlark Travelers enjoy sights and sounds of Branson, Mo.

Four holiday-themed shows, two guided tours, and a drive-thru light display were just seven ways the Meadowlark Travelers found some Christmas spirit earlier this month. From Dec. 2nd to the 5th, three Meadowlark employees were joined by 43 residents, Passport members, and friends, for an Ozark Mountain Christmas getaway in Branson, Mo. Many of the travelers remarked that the live music shows we attended were especially well-done and captivating.

"The Miracle of Christmas" at Sight & Sound Theater featured three stages, dozens of singing, dancing and "flying" actors in colorful costumes, and several live animals. There were so many four-legged participants, we could have been watching a Noah's ark story, but we learned that show doesn't begin until 2020. Yes, horses, camels, goats, sheep, and donkeys were all part of the action, walking in the aisles and onto the stages. In addition, a parrot and

two doves had small roles. The story began with the betrothal of Mary and Joseph and concluded with rejoicing prompted by the Christ child's birth in a stable in Bethlehem.

The Travelers also gave high praise to Christmas shows by the Brett



family, featuring a married couple and two of their three children, and the Hughes family, led by four brothers. The first act of both shows featured secular Christmas tunes. The Brett's chose a stirring tribute to veterans for a portion of their second act, while the Hughes brothers and their large families, including their wives and many, many children, performed sacred music. was high – we were wowed by the sets, the lights, the costume changes, and the talent of the singers and musicians.

At "Murder by Eggnog," the dinner theater audience followed the action to determine who poisoned visiting actor Bradley Harry Pitt. Five Meadowlark Travelers were selected to portray local folk who may or may not have had something to do with Bradley's demise. Monte



Spiller, our Resident Services Leader, portrayed Bob Humbug, and was voted "Best Audience Actor" by the crowd. Development Director Becky Fitzgerald, in a nod to her former career as a journalist, volunteered to play Paige Turner, a newspaper reporter. Jayme Minton, Support Services Director, portrayed party girl Rose O'Neill, and two Passport members, Mike Heiberger and Allen "Ole" Olsen, were bald knobbers. We all were all given hats to wear and stood and read our lines when called upon, and none of us were the guilty party.

This adventure, the 21st Travelers trip since the program began in 2004, also included a guided tour of Branson and the surrounding area – the College of the Ozarks was a highlight – as well as a

guided tour at the Titanic Museum. The replica of the RMS Titanic included more than four-million dollars worth of artifacts and reproductions of the ship's architecture. Tour-goers receive a boarding pass printed with the name of an actual 1912 passenger and biographical information about him or her, and learn the fate of that passenger in a memorial room before departing.

Our home base during our stay was Chateau on the Lake, Branson's only AAA four-diamond resort. The common spaces were decked with garlands, wreaths, ornament-laden trees, and larger-than-life-size nutcrackers. We stared in wonder at a gingerbread village created by the hotel's pastry chef and her staff.

What's a holiday-themed trip without time for shopping? Several travelers boosted the local economy at the St. James Winery, the College of the Ozark's Keeter Center, the stores of Branson Landing, and the Branson Craft Mall. On the return trip to Kansas, we made the most of a rest stop by visiting Osceola Cheese Co. in Osceola, Mo. We crowded in front of several refrigerated display cases so we could enjoy free samples before selecting cheese to purchase.

The success of Ozark Mountain Christmas has prompted questions about a Meadowlark Travelers trip in 2020. Where would you like to visit? Monte Spiller and Becky Fitzgerald welcome your destination suggestions!

During WWII, Washington, D.C. was jammed with government personnel. My trip to and from the Pentagon took riding two street cars and a bus.


