Meet Nyle Larson

Nyle and his wife, Norma, have been Meadowlark residents since Oct. 2014. Nyle and Norma were married in March of 1959. Describing himself, Nyle says, "I am not a politician or a public speaker! I am a hard working blue-jean type of guy."

Growing up on a farm in Pottawatomie County, hard work and long hours were a way of life. After a short period of time in the Army, Nyle settled in Manhattan and began working in construction, installing underground utilities for a small company.

In 1980, Nyle and Norma purchased Larson Construction, Inc. which specializes in installing sewer and water, fiber optic, cable, gas and electric. Nyle has been a part of thousands of projects throughout the state of Kansas.

Even after his retirement in 2003, he continues to be active in the company, oversees operation and management of Riley County Rural Water District #1. Their daughter and son-in-law currently operate the business.

Nyle served as the President of Construction Industry Council of Manhattan (CIC) and was a member of the Riley County Zoning and Appeals Board for 12 years. Currently, he is involved with the Kansas Quality Woodworkers Association and Flint Hills Woodturners.

The Founders and staff have done an excellent job in making Meadowlark a wonderful place to live. I feel that as a trustee I can share my knowledge of business operations and infrastructure. Voting Information

Sample ballots are now available at the Hospitality Desk.

Election Day, Tuesday, Nov. 3, is approaching quickly. The last day to register to vote is Tuesday, Oct. 13. Early voting will take place in the Courthouse annex from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. beginning Oct. 14.

If you have requested a mail-in ballot, it will be mailed to you starting on Wednesday, Oct. 14. Due to the influx of mail through postal service during election season, it is important to be ready to complete and return your ballot quickly—do your homework now and know who you're voting for. Options once you've completed and sealed your ballot:

- 1. <u>Mail</u>: Drop in a USPS mail slot for regular mail delivery.
- 2. Courthouse Drop Box: There is a ballot drop box labeled "Riley County Drop Box" (NOT the PO Box) outside of the Courthouse annex that you can put your ballot in. The ballot drop box is on the north side behind the PO Box. You can do this between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. starting Wednesday, Oct. 14.
- 3. **OR** Coordinate a Drop-Off: If you are unable to drive yourself or do not want to go inside the courthouse, you can arrange a ballot drop-off through the Hospitality Desk. Once you have your ballot sealed, you will be able to authorize another person to deliver it to the Courthouse annex drop box for you.

If you would like to coordinate an authorized drop-off or a ride to the Courthouse Drop Box, please contact the Hospitality Desk to add your name to the list. Authorized drop-offs dates and times will be announced. Rides to the Courthouse will be scheduled based on the drivers' availability.
