Annual fundraiser to benefit memory program

After a successful online auction in 2020, Meadowlark Foundation's art-related fundraiser returns as an in-person event this fall. Mark your calendars for Friday, Oct. 8! Meadowlark staff have joined with several Manhattan community members to present **Art Mingle: Ad Astra**, which benefits the Meadowlark Memory Program.

The 2021 theme, Ad Astra, which is Latin for "to the stars," is a nod to our "Prairie Star" sculpture and Meadowlark's re-

imagined Prairie Star Restaurant and new Event Space. Guests are invited to mingle with friends amid the colorful and varied artwork in the venue. Fabulous food, lively libations, treasured tunes, and art appreciation also are part of the plan for this 4th annual celebration.

Minglers won't want to miss the Artist Showcases, featuring award-winning painters and sculptors Zak Barnes and Louis Copt. These two men, arguably "stars" of the regional art scene, will be greeting fans and making new friends while surrounded by examples of their work. An Emporia, Kan., native, Copt graduated with a degree in art from Emporia State University in

1971 and began his professional career as a full-time artist in 1985, after returning from a summer of study at the Art Students League in New York City. Barnes moved to Lawrence, Kan., in 2004 to live and create art full time in his rural home. He attended the Columbus (Ohio) School of Art and Design.

Party-goers at previous Art Mingle events raved about the array of eye-catching and tasty hors d'oeuvres, and Meadowlark chefs Stacey Hayter and John Gasser promise more palate-pleasing offerings. A specialty cocktail will be added to the beverage menu, and live music will be provided by three members of Tallgrass Express String Band.

Annie Wilson, one of the band's founding members, is an award-winning singer, songwriter, and guitarist. She has a special connection to this year's event because she's Zak Barnes's proud mother-in-law. She'll be joined by fiddle-player Derrick Doty and Carl

Reed on bass, guitar, and/or mandolin. Tallgrass Express performs bluegrass favorites, folk ballads, Western swing, and original tunes inspired by the Flint Hills.

Art Mingle 2021 offers silent and live auctions, featuring original art from our Showcase guests and

This year's historical component is an exhibit featuring Meadowlark's "Prairie Star" sculpture, which was created by the late Elden Tefft. 
