

Art Engagement from the Beach Museum of Art



Undetermined Shiva as Lord of Dance (Nataraja), 20th century Cast bronze by lost wax

This rendition of Shiva was probably produced by one of the workshops in Swamimalai in southern India, a production hub for bronze sculptures of Hindu deities destined for temples, private collections, and the tourist trade. These workshops employ ancient techniques to this day.

KSU, Marianna Kistler Beach Museum of Art, gift of Dr. & Mrs. Albert B. Franklin, 1985.155

The Hindu god Shiva appears here in the form of Natarāja, Lord of Dance. Shiva watches over the endless cycle of time; this dance demonstrates that cycle. Starting in the Tenth Century, figures of Shiva are carried in processions through the streets watched by hundreds of people. (Please see below for the origin of the rendition shown here.) This sculpture symbolizes the cycle of destruction and rebirth of the universe. Shiva is encircled by a ring of fire that will destroy all in the end. One hand holds a small drum which maintains the rhythm of the dance. Another hand holds a small flame, denoting the power of destruction and creation. The hand with the palm up evokes protection. The hand pointing down draws our eye to the dwarf that Shiva is standing on, which represents ignorance. As you look closely at this sculpture what do you notice that would suggest this is a dance? You may view this Shiva on exhibit now at the Beach Museum of Art.
