

In addition, the Kite's Bar & Grill menu will be available throughout the day. The Bar & Grill offers burgers, dawgs, and wraps, as well as soups, salads, and specialties, such as chicken fried steak, and spicy shrimp.

Art Engagement *from the Beach Museum of Art*

Fall color... Art is not the only place pigments are present, they are in leaves too. Carotenoids (yellow, orange, brown) and chlorophyll (basic green) occur in the leaf cells during the growing season. Anthocyanin (blue, red, purple) is produced in the fall. As the nights grow longer, chlorophyll production decreases and the other colors within the cells begin to appear. The weather conditions affect the intensity of the color. As you enjoy this watercolor, what do you notice about the artist's use of color to express the changing season? What hues are used? Are they complementary or analogous? How does the artist use value to create contrast?
