Pearl Harbor Docuseries

"... December 7, 1941—a date which will live in infamy—the United States of America was suddenly and deliverately attacked by naval and air forces of the Empire of Japan." -President Franklin Roosevelt

This year, Netflix released a limited docuseries titled Attack on Pearl Harbor: *Minute by Minute.* This three-episode series uses archival footage and interviews with survivors to chronicle the attack that changed the course of World War II.



Over the next three weeks, Grosh Cinema will offer showings for each episode. Episode one, Countdown to War, will play at 1, 4, and 7 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 22. Japanese forces plan an attack against a US naval base in Hawaii. One of the last living Japanese survivors speaks in an interview for the first time.

The second and third episodes will play in Grosh Cinema Tuesday, Nov. 29, and Tuesday, Dec. 6.

Winter Birdwatching: UFM Class Monday, Nov. 28, at 10 a.m.

UFM Lifetime Learning and Meadowlark present *Winter Birdwatching*. This three-session course will begin Monday, Nov. 28, from 10 a.m. to noon in the Community Room. The second and third sessions will meet Tuesday, Nov. 29, and Wednesday, Nov. 30.

Led by Tim Cable, Winter Birdwatching participants will be introduced to birds that spend their winters in the Manhattan area. Winter birds include many types of waterfowl, raptors, finches, and sparrows. This course will include both classroom sessions and field trips to observe birds at local birding locations. 

Art Engagement from the Beach Museum of Art

Illusion ... The artist that created this print is Victor Vasarely. He was one of the leading individuals in the Optical Art (OpArt) movement. His experimentation with geometric shapes and colors on a two-dimensional surface led to optical illusions like the surface tension seen in this artwork. His use of color variation and his manipulation of shapes could create spherical distortion. As you look at this image, what shapes do you notice and how do they change throughout the print? Where do you notice Vasarely's color fluctuating to further the illusion?
