They're back! Through Meadowlark's partnership with Blueville Nursery, the Christmas lights have returned to campus.

The light display first came to Meadowlark in 2020. In 2021, Meadowlark's leadership team wanted to extend the light show to more areas of campus. This expansion resulted in more than 16,200 feet of LED lights, which is just over three miles in length. Adding this electric cheer is no simple task. The planning process for our light display begins during the summer months and includes tree selection, identifying power supply, ordering lights, and of

course, hanging the strands. This year, the team added two 20-foot tall flag-pole trees—one on top of the Event Center and the other on a Monarch roof. The team had to find a design that would withstand our gusty Kansas winds at that height.

Pete Reid with Blueville Nursery is instrumental in executing the holiday lights. "It has been my pleasure to serve the community at Meadowlark over the years," Pete said. "I wish you all joy and peace through this wonderful season!"


