Stillman Cemetery

In the early 2000s, Meadowlark was in phase two of a three-phase growth and evolution as a community. As a part of this expansion, Meadowlark planned to add a neighborhood of cottages known as Meadowlark Circle. However, there was a hurdle: a small family cemetery dating from the mid-1800s to 1900. The original cemetery had a least four formal headstones, all of which had been removed by early in the 20th century. Thus, by the early 21st

century, almost nothing was known about this cemetery other than its location.

In preparation for construction, and with exhumation authority from Riley County District Court, the original cemetery was excavated in the summer of 2004 by professional archeologists under the direction of Donna C. Roper, Ph.D., of Manhattan.

The cemetery lies near the northwest corner of a parcel of land patented to Dr. William Henry Stillman in 1860. Born in Rhode Island, he first came to the

Manhattan area in 1855 and took up land in Blue Township in western Pottawatomie County. He soon returned to Rhode Island, but then returned to Manhattan a few years later, only to find someone else had taken over his Blue Township land. At this time, he obtained the land in eastern Rilev County that he held until his death. He lived in a house, since demolished, on a small terrace low on the bluff slope, about 120 yards southeast of the original cemetery. which is where Meadowlark Circle duplexes now stand.

UFM Lifetime Learning Classes

History of Western Music: Classical & Romantic

UFM Lifetime Learning presents *History of Western Music: Classical and Romantic*. This threesession course will begin Tuesday, Oct. 22, from 6 to 7:30 p.m. in the Community Room. The second and third session will meet Tuesday, Oct. 29, and Nov. 5.

Olivia Arnold, music instructor at Cloud County Community College, will lead the music history lectures focused on the Classical and Romantic eras. Classical music, regarded as structured and elegant, led by figures such as Haydn and Mozart, clashes against the raw emotions and virtuosity of Romantic music, from Beethoven, Liszt, Tchaikovsky, and Faure. How did musical ideas and tastes change so dramatically over these roughly 150 years? The class will highlight composers, educators, historical movements, and musicians that shaped the development of these musical eras.

World War I: Europe's Collective Suicide

UFM Lifetime Learning presents *World War I: Europe's Collective Suicide*. This three-session course will begin Wednesday, Oct. 30, from 6:30 to 8 p.m. in the Community Room. The second and third sessions will meet Wednesday, Nov. 6, and Nov. 13.

This first week's lecture will focus on the causes of the Great War and the first year of the conflict. The second class will examine he widening war of 1915 with the entrance of Italy on the side of the Allies. The final lecture will concentrate on America's entrance into the war, the collapse of Czarist Russia, the end of the war, and the Treaty of Versailles. The events of the first Great War of the 20th century still impact the world in the 21st century.

Enrollment is now open for both courses and can be completed by calling (785) 539-8763. This class is offered through UFM at no charge to Meadowlark residents, and Passport members may attend with a 20-percent discount.

Stillman was a farmer and physician. During the 40 years he lived here, he provided indigent care and, in the period from at least 1800 to 1893, ran an unofficial poor farm. The possibility that he also operated an unofficial orphanage has not been confirmed. Stillman actively sold or leased portions of his property throughout his life, but he retained this portion of the property until his death in 1900.

Meadowlark hosted a Dedication and Re-Internment Ceremony for the Stillman Cemetery on Friday, Sept. 14, 2007, complete with period dress and a horse-drawn merchant wagon procession. Seventeen graves were re-interred. The video of the ceremony will be shown once a day starting Monday, Oct. 21, through Friday, Oct. 25, in Grosh Cinema. The showing each day will be at 10 a.m.

To visit the cemetery in its current location, enter Meadowlark's loop trail on the south side of Meadowlark Road at the northeast corner of campus, near the Tuttle Creek entrance.
