Join us on Wednesday, Dec. 11, to discover how Tai Chi can benefit you, learn about class schedules, and register for the upcoming sessions in January.



## Art Engagement from the Beach Museum of Art

One-point perspective is created when an artist draws things smaller as they get further away, converging toward a single "vanishing point" on the horizon line. Using one-point perspective is often found when the subject is viewed from the front, like looking down a road. In this print, the road leads our eye directly to a vanishing point. As you look closely at the other objects in this image, do you find them also "pointing" your eye to the same location on the horizon line? Which objects or actions seem to be assisting in moving your eye to a single point?
