

Severe Weather Alert



With a thunderstorm or tornado in the forecast, do Meadowlark residents know how to respond?

Here are some definitions to remember and procedures to follow when a thunderstorm or tornado is in the forecast:

Thunderstorms

In a **thunderstorm watch**, no actual storm exists, but conditions make a dangerous storm likely.

A **thunderstorm warning** indicates high winds and dangerous hail are in the area, with the possibility for major damage.

Procedure for all residents during a thunderstorm watch or warning: Stay indoors until severe weather passes. Stay away from windows, if there are high winds or hail. Turn on a weather radio if you have one.

Tornadoes

In a **tornado watch**, no actual tornado exists, but

weather conditions make severe thunderstorms likely, with the possibility of creating a tornado.

A **tornado warning** means a funnel cloud has been spotted or an actual tornado is on the ground. Take cover immediately.

Procedures for weathering a tornado differ, depending on the location of one's home at Meadowlark. All independent living residents should go into a building immediately. Do not use an elevator.

Residents in a **West Tower apartment** should take stairs to the first floor and sit out the storm on the first floor near Prairie Star Restaurant. If you cannot get to the first floor, go to the center hallway of the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, or 5th floor. If you cannot get to these locations, stay in your apartment with the door to the hallway closed. Proceed to a bathroom and close the door.

Residents in an **East Village apartment** should sit

69 YEARS AGO

Sixty-nine years ago, I was taking lessons to earn my pilot's license. A Kansas farm boy wanting to fly?! I was already logging hours in the air as I was a member of the 82nd Airborne Division stationed at Ft. Bragg, N.C. Had I ever really wanted to fly a plane!

Probably! But had I ever thought seriously about it because you needed money for lessons and plane rentals?

No. Not until I became friends with two other officers living in my BOQ (bachelor officers' quarters). They were pilots in the 82nd Airborne Division Aviation Unit. They flew on the job but, "on the side" had purchased a small, two-seater, single-engine plane, and they flew around locally on weekends for fun and recreation. These friends were Jim Crozier and Jack O'Keefe.

But, guess what?! One day they offered to teach me to learn to fly in their airplane. No charge for lessons, no charge for fuel or plane rental.

You cannot beat that! It probably took me 30 seconds to say, "YES! When do we begin?"

So, on July 29, 1956, either Jim or Jack, gave me my first lesson and yes, I can prove it, as I still have my Pilot Log Book (pictured above).

The plane was a 1941 TALORCRAFT powered by an 85-horsepower Lycoming air-cooled engine. There were two side-by-side seats making it ideal for instruction. This type of plane was widely used in World War II for training pilots. It was a single-wing monoplane with a steel frame covered by special canvas, and painted light green. It weighed only 800 pounds. The landing gear was fixed with a small tail wheel. The cruising speed was 85 to 90 miles per hour. They stored the plane at Myrtle Airport near Selma, N.C., only 40 or so miles from Ft. Bragg.

As Jim, Jack, and I were "on duty," my training sessions were mainly on weekends, lasting for one to two hours. They did limited training for free, but I must have paid at least for the fuel consumed. My

Tour coordinator Tim Lindemuth said the Sunken Gardens will have approximately 35,000 annuals planted by that date, and the rose garden will be blooming.

A train will give tour-goers an overall view of Omaha's vast Lauritzen Gardens. Following the ride, there will be time to explore. Staff said the iris, peony, rose, and baptisia (False Indigo) collections will be in bloom.

The bus trip concludes with a plant shopping spree at Mulhall's Nursery, Omaha's premier retail garden center. Lindemuth said interested shoppers should bring a laundry basket lined with plastic that can be stored in the bus's luggage compartment for plant purchases.

An executive box lunch will be served with several meat, gluten free, and vegan choices made with the tour registration.

The tour cost is \$125 per person and includes round-trip bus transportation, garden admissions, train ride, guided tours, and lunch. Registration and payment are done online at the secure K-State Gardens website, ksu.edu/gardens.

first solo flight was on Nov. 4. An AA certified flight instructor also gave me lessons. After 12 hours of training, I was certified to fly solo. That's when the real fun began.

JANUARY 2, 1957: I was released from the Army and flew to Ithaca, N.Y., where I had just enrolled as a graduate student at Cornell University. I rented a plane hangar at Tompkins County Airport (near Ithaca) for \$25 per month.

MARCH 2, 1957: I took my girlfriend, Nancy Bird, for a plane ride. It was our first date and later we got married.

MARCH, APRIL, MAY, & JUNE 1957: I took local and regional flights to Ithaca for practice and to view the wonderful central New York scenery.

JULY 4, 1957: I flew home to Kansas via Memphis

out the storm in the first floor hallway near Prairie Star Restaurant or walk to the 2nd or 3rd floor hallway of the West Tower. Do not take the stairs.

If an **East Village** resident is unable to walk to any of these locations, stay in the apartment in a bathroom with the door closed.

Both **East and West Village** residents should wait for an "all clear" to be given before returning to their apartments.

Residents in a **Monarch apartment** should take the stairs to the west side of the underbuilding parking area and shelter away from doors. If you are unable to go to the garage, stay in the apartment in the primary bathroom with the door closed.

Residents in a **cottage, Monarch, or garden apartment** should not try to reach the Community Center. Stay in your home and close doors and curtains.

If you live in a **garden apartment** or **classic cottage**, proceed to a room that does not have an exterior wall, such as a bathroom or hallway.

If you live in a **Meadowlark Valley or Meadowlark Circle cottage** and have a safe room, proceed to the safe room and turn on a weather radio. Listen for the "all clear" announcement.

For details related to your location, consult your Resident Handbook. During a storm situation, anyone who has a weather radio or regular radio should keep it on. Residents also are invited to turn their TVs to a local station for weather updates.

where I visited brother Philip who was there in the Navy.

JULY 9, 1957: Flew to Severance, Kan., (west of St. Joseph, Mo.) and landed in my father's alfalfa field.

JULY 14, 1957: I flew to visit family in western Nebraska.

JULY 19, 1957: I took the longest flight ever as I flew from Lewellen, Neb., to Ithaca, N.Y. It was an 18-hour flight, but I had to land in Kendallville, Ind., to spend the night.

AUGUST 1957 to APRIL 1958: I took several flights before I sold my airplane in April 1958.

TOTAL FLYING TIME LOGGED: 165 hours. Not much, but it was a lot of fun.
